Primary Learning

This week was Book Week, with a host of activities going on across the school through the theme of 'Poetry', including author visits, interactive workshops, buddy reading across year groups and culminating in our Book Week Assembly!





Early Years learners had the chance to immerse themselves in science and technology at Petrosians, The Discovery Centre. They made links in their learning from the IEYC unit 'Press it, Click it'. They experienced discovery with interactive exhibits and came face-to-face with science and technology in new ways through a variety of activities.





Year 4 learners turned Fashion Designers; in this Unit we will be learning about fashion from the present, past and future. Learners will explore different textile techniques and will learn how to apply them to add design features and colours to our work. We started with our Junk Fashion Show followed by a trip to Karyaneka - Malaysian Crafts.





Wednesday's Forest School session was fantastic. The session started with the Nexus Wolves learning how to build a fire that was good for cooking. After eating the learners followed their interests, some in creative, unstructured play, others collaborating on building projects or exploring.

Over recent weeks the year 7's have explored the Geography, History and Culture of Malaysia as well as experiencing virtual museum visits to Institutions such as the Natural History Museum in London and The Louvre. Following this they were



encouraged to develop their skills of collaboration and effective communication working as part of a predetermined team in order to design a 'Malaysia Museum and exhibit a selection of work.







We welcomed many visitors to Nexus this week, in addition to our Book Week guests who will be featured next week. It continues to be an exciting time for Higher Education with our 7th university fair of this academic year. Monday saw members from the prestigious Russell Group of universities in the UK come to Nexus once more to promote their institutions and speak face to face with interested prospective applicants. While our year 12s are beginning their exploration and had the chance to discuss fields of study, entrance requirements and scholarships it was a fantastic opportunity for some of our year 13 offer holders to interact with representatives from the Universities they plan on attending. Our History learners enjoyed a follow up lecture from Professor Stephen Tyre on Thursday on the topic of decolonisation and were complimented for their excellent questioning and engagement in the session.



We also welcomed Mr BK Gan, the President of Taylors Schools, to Nexus this week for the annual lunch with the Integral Student Council. Mr BK was very impressed by our learners and they also enjoyed the chance to find out more about Taylors Schools over the course of their time together.

This year's theme was #challengedby and over the course of three days, delegates debated topics such as human rights, militarisation and freedom of speech amongst others. 
