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KEY OBJECTIVES OF THE POSITION

- Develop **learner focused relationships** to ensure that the EAL learners feel safe, respected and are not afraid of asking for help and making mistakes.
- Meeting with EAL learners' parents to discuss progress and recommend support at home.
- Conducting consistent reading and writing assessments to track their English development and in order to ascertain when it is appropriate for the learners to exit the IE Programme and join mainstream lessons.

In addition, the Primary EAL teacher will be

- Attending some planning sessions with Inclusion and class teachers to contribute to whole class and EAL learners' success lesson planning.
- Collaborating with other Inclusion and class teachers to ensure that EAL teaching is aligned with the Nexus Way and class learning to facilitate interconnected rigorous learning.
- **Initiating and preparing differentiated EAL** materials for application in IPC, Maths and Language Arts.
- Supporting EAL learners in classes such as IPC and Language Arts.
- Attending and leading related **Professional Development** sessions.
- Share innovative and successful ideas with class teachers to support and teach EAL learners in class.
- Keep important documents up to date.
