As part of the schools role in being the only school in Malaysia to be accredited at Mastering level for the IPC, Nexus will be hosting the first regional meeting **next Wednesday afternoon.** 15 delegates from IPC schools across KL will join together to discuss the best ways of learning with the IPC.

Nexus learner's sporting achievements outside of school continues with **Year 6 learner, Miqail Lob** who has been selected to represent PKNS Football Club as a goalkeeper. The team will take part in 1MCC (1 Malaysia Cardiff City) League and Mikhail will train three times per week.

MP3 Spotlight

We are learning to write a balanced argument. We are learning about mass and weight and the effects of gravity.

Year 5's space cadets have been busy this week preparing themselves for a possible space mission. There is a buzz of excitement in the Nexus Space Academy and the questions on everybody's lips are: 'Where will we go?' and 'what will we take with us?"

'Where will we go?'

The choice is a one-way trip to either Mars or Venus and the opportunity for their names to go down in history. I decided to interview some of the cadets to see which destination they favored! Lieutenant Naufal informed me that he felt Mars would be the best choice as it has a similar day and night pattern to Venus. Alternatively Lieutenant Yi Chen argued that Mars might not be such a good option as there is not enough oxygen in the air for astronauts to breath without their space suits. Another cadet (Lieutenant Ariane) stressed that nobody wants to be stuck in a space suit for the rest of his or her life!

"How do you know so much about Mars and Venus?"

"We have been very rigorous and used our enquiry skills to find information from books, posters, YouTube videos and websites!" Lieutenant Marcus informed me.

The important decision has been put into the cadet's hands. They have been asked to use their enquiry skills and flexible thinking to come up with reasons 'For' and 'Against' going on a mission to Mars rather than Venus. These reasons will be included in their piece of discursive writing, which will detail both sides of the argument as well as the opinion of the space cadet. This will be submitted to the academy and the most popular opinion (Mars or Venus) will become the destination for the mission.

'What will we take with us?"

Before making the decision about what to take, the space cadets learnt about mass and weight and how they are different. They were then asked to investigate what the mass and weight of some of the scientific equipment they would take with them on their mission was. I asked some of the cadets what they had learnt about mass and weight. Lieutenant Arissa told me that she had learnt that mass stays the same wherever you are but weight can change. Lieutenant Michelle said she learnt to use a newton meter, which is a skill. The cadets have much more preparation and learning to do before their mission but they are making great progress.



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Year 1 Trip to Kidzania

In Year 1, this half term, the children are learning about the world of work through the IPC theme 'The Things People Do'. In order to 'hook' the children on this theme, we took them to Kidzania. Through role-playing the learners were able to know and understand more about various jobs and professions within society as well as the activities and responsibilities that go along with these.

This was an excellent opportunity for children to understand the purpose of work – not only for their own personal monetary gain, but also to provide a service to society. Many of our learners have never had to take responsibility for their own money, and have never had the opportunity to earn money nor use this money earned to purchase goods – it was amazing to see those who were more reluctant to spend their hard earned cash!

Not only did the trip to Kidzania allow children to explore these concepts and come to an understanding that money, in fact, does not just appear from the ether, it has to be earned and it should be spent wisely. Additionally, they quickly learned that certain jobs were more desirable to them, because they earned different amount for different jobs, some children showed real drive to bank more than their friends to be able to purchase the item they wanted at the end of the day! This learning experience has proved to be extremely purposeful for our learners as through working with their peers, role playing -and dare I say it - having fun, they have learned so much more about jobs in society today than they could have within the constraints of a traditional classroom and 'learning by doing' they are bound to remember the learning experience that has taken place. Our learners are now completely enthused and ready to learn more about 'The Things People Do' within and across the different curricular subjects.
