About the Presenter: David Vinegrad

As the Director of Behaviour Matters he is recognised as a world leader in the development of school based Restorative Practice. He has pioneered the application of Restorative Justice in the classroom, corridor and playground to enhance, promote and repair relationships. With his colleague Marg Thorsborne, he has authored 4 books and training manuals about Restorative Practice.

David is a well-known presenter with extensive experience in the area of Behaviour Management both nationally and internationally.

David's expertise and abilities in this area have been recognised at all levels. Over the years he has initiated and supported several student management initiatives that may be regarded by some as being revolutionary.

David has spent over 30 years working with teachers and students in a variety of diverse educational settings undertaking and developing a wide range of roles. He has taught in Tasmania and Victoria and has a Bachelor of Education and a Master of Education in Counseling and Adolescent Development.

In 1993 David pioneered Restorative Practice in Tasmania and then moved onto Victoria to passionately spread the word. His experience includes working with Tasmanian Police to incorporate conferencing as a juvenile justice intervention, worked with the Singapore Ministry of Education training Guidance Branch Officers and the staff of pilot schools as a first Restorative Practice initiative for Singapore. David has recently returned to Melbourne to continue his consultancy after working for 7 years in a range of international schools in Japan and Brazil.



CAS Reflection

Recently I had started playing a new piece for my upcoming examination. The new piece that I am currently practising is a classical jazz, this is different from my other examination piece as I had never choosen to do a jazz song for my examination; I used to only play classical in the baroque and romantic period. To improve on my jazz piece, I had started to use a new approach in my practice. I would first analyse the chords that are being used in the score, before I actually start playing, this had shown to be effective, as there are less errors in my playing compared to they way that had practiced it before. Other than my pieces that I am practising, I am also playing some new scales such as the chromatic third apart scale, while I had played chromatic scales in the past; this is my first time trying it in third apart. In my practise, I notice that my scales and arpeggio are currently more polished compared to my pieces as I had been more focus on them in my past practices; this means that in my future practices I need to start focusing more on the pieces that I am playing instead.
