



It was such a success that it will now become a regular fixture in the Nexus Calendar.






FOOTBALL TRAINING CAS reflection by Abi Satria Praga

Nexus has managed to secure the services of an excellent drummer and teacher, Faeez Ikhwan, BA (Hons). Faeez will be starting teaching Drums at Nexus from 27th April.

Faeez Ikhwan, BA (Hons) is a full-time musician who is the founding member and drummer of a local rock band called Drama Band. Faeez's band has been widely known for their popular songs being made into soundtracks for movies and TV shows. Drama Band has also been nominated in several different local music awards and celebrations.

He started playing music whilst studying in Victoria Institution Kuala Lumpur. In his High School, he was a member of the school's cadet corp. marching band. He played marching band for his entire school days and has participated in numerous national and international marching band competitions. After finishing High School, he got accepted to pursue his studies in music at Diploma level and majoring in percussion and drums. During his time there he was exposed to more diverse types of music genres other than marching band music. Faeez completed his studies when he received a BA (Hons) Degree in Music Performance from UiTM.

Faeez is also a member of a well-known percussion group called No Noise Percussion. They are very popular both locally and nationally for their usage of unconventional everyday items as a percussion instrument and they play mostly stomp-based music. The No Noise Percussion team has travelled to most part of Malaysia performing in festivals, and in private and public functions. He has a passionate for teaching and started his teaching career whilst doing clinics and team building session with No Noise Percussion. Faeez has not stop teaching since then and is excited to share his lifelong passion for drumming and percussion with the learners at Nexus.
