Last week the learners of Year 3 visited FRIM (Forest Reserve Institute Malaysia) as the entry point for their new IPC topic 'Saving The World'. Some of the learners wrote a report of their trip.

As soon as we got on the bus, everyone was very nervous and excited. We didn't know what to expect from our trip to the rainforest. We had a long trip ahead of us but we didn't mind because we were playing games and talking to each other. The air con was very cold, like it was snowing on the bus!

Firstly, when we arrived, we had snack and then we had to face the most 'challenging" bathroom but we tried to be adaptable and not complain about it. Some of us just didn't go at all. After that we visited a pond and saw huge eels. We had not expected that one would be male and one would be female. They were long, about 2 metres and were good swimmers. Next we went to the gallery. Wesaw products made from the rainforest trees and learnt that a whole tree can make a dinner table.

Finally, we went hiking in the rainforest. We were surprised by the loud sounds of the forest made by animals and insects. We were amazed by how tall the trees were. The guide gave us all different kinds of leaves to smell. One leaf smelt like garlic, another one smelt like tea! The sizes of some of the leaves were gigantic, bigger than a year 3 learner. The roots made a lovely set of stairs to climb up and down on the trail, that was a surprise for us. We saw a tree that looked like a fossil and pretty patterned leaves. 


The Primary school is having a 'dance-a-thon' with primary learners on Friday 21st Feb (last day of half-term) and the learners have had sponsor sheets home.

After 10 weeks of running 5km every week, I have achieved my goal of decreasing my running time. This was all done by increasing my awareness of my strengths and areas of growth; by finding areas that I needed to improve on. My running time has been decreased from 1 hour to 30-20 minutes. Also, I have successfully committed myself by enforcing a strict running routine for myself that continued for a duration of 10 weeks.

Moreover, I managed to show perseverance throughout the my running routine by continuing in order to complete a running time of 5km even though it was challenging. Throughout this entire activity, I've definitely developed several new skills. One would be skills that enhance running speed and decrease stopping time, for example, placing your foot a certain way when your foot touches the ground while running. Also, finding a breathing pattern that suits me best and maintaining it throughout the 5km run. Another set of skills that I managed to develop throughout the activity would be maintaining perseverance. One of the main goals was to increase stamina and this has been achieved. I can run for longer and at a faster speed compared to when I first started this activity and compared to before I started this activity.

The activity has been a learning curve for me, not only physically but also mentally. The perseverance that I've showed were both physically and mentally. I managed to keep a strict routine for myself regardless of whether or not I wanted to. I also managed to develop running skills that I have been able to use in daily life and sporting events. For example, breathing and running techniques. This was due to my awareness of my strengths and areas of growth, without a doubt, I learned something new every time I went for a run.

Finally, this activity has been very beneficial for me personally and the increase in stamina will help me with future action activities.

ELL Information

Soon the results from the mock exams will be released. This is a good time for learners and parents to reflect on the study habits of the learners and make any indicated improvements. For parents of younger children, you can start helping your children develop good study habits now.

Study Tips & Study Skills

Students with better study methods and strategies score higher on their exams.

- 1. Everyone is different. Different methods work for different people; the following are only suggestions on improving upon your current studying techniques.
- 2. It is best to review the material right after class when it's still fresh in your memory.
- Don't try to do all your studying the night before the test. Instead space out your studying, review class materials at least several times a week, focusing on one topic at a time.
- 4. Have all of your study material in front of you: lecture notes, course textbooks, study guides and any other relevant material.
- Find a comfortable and quiet place to study with good lighting and little distractions (try avoiding your own bed; it is very tempting to just lie down and take a nap).
- 6. Start out by studying the most important information.
- 7. Learn the general concepts first, don't worry about learning the details until you have learned the main ideas.
- 8. Take notes and write down a summary of the important ideas as you read through your study material.
- 9. Take short breaks frequently. Your memory retains the information that you study at the beginning and the end better than what you study in the middle.

- 10. Space out your studying, you'll learn more by studying a little every day instead of waiting to cram at the last minute. By studying every day, the material will stay in your long-term memory but if you try to study at the last moment, the material will only reside in your short-term memory that you'll easily forget.
- 11. Make sure that you understand the material well, don't just read through the material and try to memorize everything.
- 12. If you choose to study in a group, only study with others who are serious about the test.
- 13. Test yourself or have someone test you on the material to find out what your weak and strong areas are. You can use the review questions at the end of each chapter, practice tests that the teacher may give out or other pertinent materials.
- 14. Listening to relaxing music such as classical or jazz on a low volume can relieve some of the boredom of studying.
- 15. Don't study later than the time you usually go to sleep, you may fall asleep or be tempted to go to sleep, instead try studying in the afternoon or early evening. If you are a morning person try studying in the morning.
