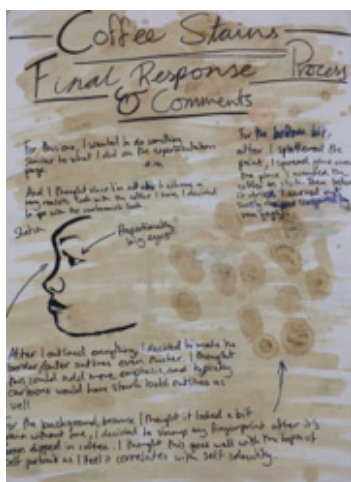

Our delegation managed to get five awards in total, and we managed to get the award for the Best Delegation overall, in the whole conference!

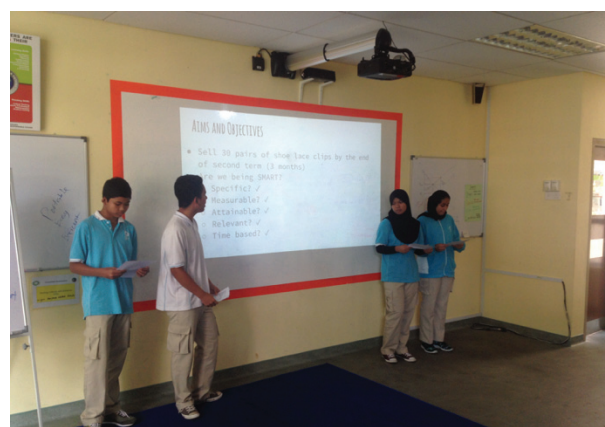
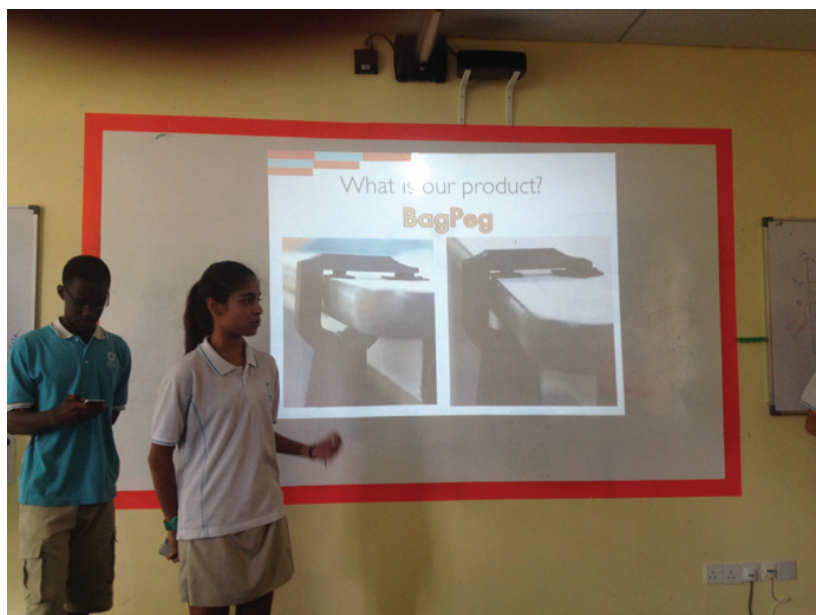
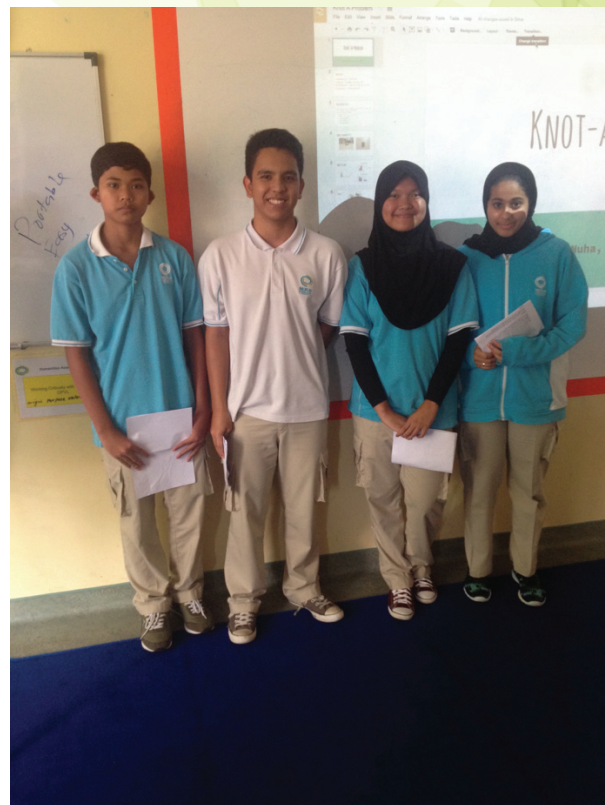
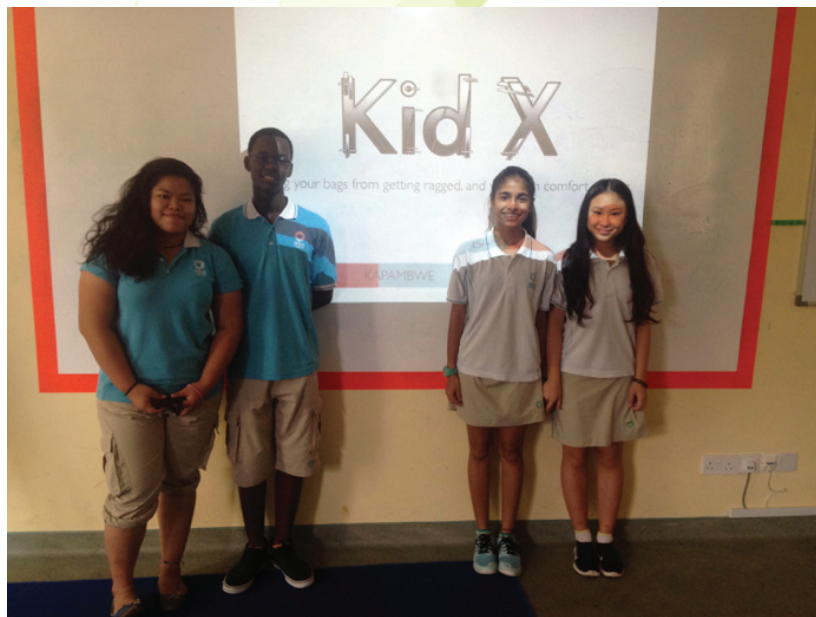

Once upon a time there was a story-teller...

An account of Andy Wright's Visit to Nexus

Nexus were fortunate to host the acclaimed storyteller, Andy Wright on Wednesday. Andy delivered several sessions throughout the day to learners, teachers and parents about the art of storytelling.

First up were the Year 7 Learners who were regaled with a highly entertaining story about Andy's grandfather's glow-in-the-dark white legs! Andy then went on to tell Year 7 about the three key areas of telling a good story. He said that a great story must contain three elements:

- People = WHO
- Places = WHERE
- Events = WHEN

These elements are then framed around the idea of a bucket of water in which the water represents the plot and the bucket is the framework in which the listener or reader holds all of the plot elements. The sides and bottom of the bucket represent the elements that hold the plot together.



Using this idea, Andy then demonstrated how the learners can construct their own stories with this framework. The workshop finished with the learners and Andy constructing a story together.

Here's what the Year 7 learners had to say about their workshop:

What did you enjoy most about the workshop?

Fazwan: "The way he presented his story to us was insanely awesome!"

Terence: "I liked that how the way that he tell the story using the voice and gesture."

Hazwani: "I loved everything about it! It was funny and entertaining."

How will you use what you learnt?

Michelle: "I would use the "Bucket Method" he taught us because sometimes when I am writing I don't really have a plan and I go all over the place."

Andrea: "If I write a story, this will be helpful for letting my reader know all the details, or we could deliberately hide the details for a mystery."

Qayleb: "I have never been very good at story structure but what Mr Andy said about the bucket and plot will help me in the future when I have to write or tell stories."



Andy Wright then did a workshop with Year 10. The format and content was much the same as the previous workshop, just tweaked here and there for this older year group. There was much laughing from the group with lots of learners willingly participating at appropriate times. At the end of the session Andy was pleased when a particular learner took the time to stop and have a conversation about his "Grandfather's legs," which had been a feature of a story that Andy had relayed. The over-riding message from this workshop was that no matter what age, or how 'cool' teenagers may think they are, they are never too old for a good story.

Later in the day Andy conducted two training workshops with the Secondary English teachers and Primary teachers to provide tips and hints for story writing and building this into different scenarios. All the teachers thoroughly enjoyed these sessions and can't wait to try out these ideas with their own classes.

A bonus event, in a jam packed day, was Andy's workshop for parents to promote reading to and with our children as we foster literacy both in the home and the school.
